Carole DeMille from Massachusetts General Hospital, along with Betsy Pantelick from Yale New Haven, Pat Lynch, and others, met at the CDC training program (1200G) for nurse epidemiologists. The course was organized by

Claire Coppage of CDC who was the driving force behind the formation of APIC. Claire recruited 2 members of each 1200 G class to serve on a national steering committee to begin planning what would eventually become the Association for Practitioners in Infection Control.




